## KENYA TOURISM FEDERATION - HEALTH & TRAVEL ADVISORY UPDATE

**Validity Period: 30<sup>th</sup> June 2026**

Following the previous Health and Travel Advisory, the Kenya Tourism Federation (KTF) continues to provide regular information to the local travel trade, international partners, and intending visitors regarding the regional Ebola situation and its implications for travel to Kenya.

### CURRENT SITUATION:

Kenyan Health authorities remain vigilant and are closely monitoring developments within the region. Specifically:

1. Kenya remains free of any Ebola cases.
2. Enhanced surveillance and screening measures continue to be implemented at designated points of entry in line with guidance from the Ministry of Health and other public health authorities.
3. Existing public health preparedness measures, including traveller surveillance and monitoring protocols, remain operational and continue to be reviewed as necessary.

### TOURISM RISK ASSESSMENT

Despite multiple Ebola outbreaks occurring over several decades in different parts of Africa, there is currently no confirmed or well-documented case of any tourist becoming infected with Ebola. This is in respect to undertaking normal tourism activities such as safaris, sightseeing, beach holidays, business travel, hotel stays, restaurant visits or use of commercial transport services.

The World Health Organization (WHO), and public health authorities have consistently assessed the risk to tourists as extremely low because Ebola transmission is through direct contact with body fluids of symptomatic infected persons.

Moreover, KTF has continued and will continue to work closely with relevant Government agencies, tourism stakeholders and international partners to ensure that accurate and timely information is available to the travelling public. We encourage intending visitors and travel partners to proceed with their travel plans and continue to enjoy the diverse experiences that Magical Kenya has to offer.

**This update remains valid until 30th June 2026 unless significant developments warrant earlier communication.**
